#### Course Description

This clinically oriented seminar will review a variety of oral mucosal and jawbone responses and “injuries” resulting from the local use of medications, tobaccos and recreational drugs. It will also review responses to systemic drugs and diseases. Factitious injuries, including bulimia, will also be discussed. Taken together, this group of confusing entities is difficult to diagnose and treatment is often problematic. The seminar will, therefore, emphasize differential diagnosis and therapeutic options.

#### Learning Objectives

At the end of the course participants will:

- Be able to list many of the oral and jawbone effects of recreational and prescribed medication.
- Have a good awareness of the effects of certain habits (bulimia, gum and candy chewing, lemon sucking, etc.) on the oral mucosa.
- Be able to explain the differential diagnosis and treatment options for a wide variety of oral and jawbone effects of drugs, other products and certain habits.

#### About the Presenters



Jerry Bouquot, DDS, MSD, was trained at the University of Minnesota, the Mayo Clinic and The Royal College of Dentistry in Copenhagen, Denmark. For 17 years he was the Chair of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology at West Virginia University. He is now Chair of Diagnostic Sciences at The University of Texas Dental Branch in Houston. He is co-author of the most popular textbook of oral pathology and has been President of the American Board of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology, a Senior Visiting Scientist of the Mayo Clinic, a president of 3 different dental associations and a Director of the national Board of Directors of the American Cancer Society. Dr. Bouquot is a nationally known researcher and lecturer. In his seminars, he emphasizes clinical features of disease, differential diagnosis and disease management, with much practical information based on his lifetime experiences in an active clinical oral pathology (oral medicine) practice and one of the nation's largest oral pathology biopsy services.



Cleverick D. “CD” Johnson, DDS, MS, earned his dental degree from University of Texas Dental Branch in 1986 following a Masters in Biology 1981 from Texas Southern University and completed a Minority Science Fellowship at the University of Houston College of Pharmacy 1982. He is an Associate Professor at The University of Texas Health Science Center Dental Branch, department of Restorative and Biomaterials, where he is the Director of the Urgent Care Dental Clinic. He has published extensively on the oral diagnosis and substance abuse. He has received many awards and honors including the nationally recognized “Jefferson Award” for public and humanitarian in 2002 for his contributions to science and dentistry.
